Who Needs An Educational Assessment?

An Educational Assessment is required for students who are not currently enrolled at The Lewis School with the exception of SAT/ACT “PREP”™, although, evaluating a student’s level of performance can identify and predict weak skills in need of reinforcement and repair for college. The assessment is designed to develop a detailed understanding of individual learning strengths and weaknesses. At the conclusion of the assessment, a conference with **both parents/guardians** is held to discuss the findings of the assessment as well as recommendations for placement.

Lewis School SAT/ACT instruction is multisensory, disciplined, rigorous and brings the advantages of multisensory learning in test preparation. This course is ideal for students who want to significantly improve their performance on the SAT/ACT. The approach taken at the Lewis School involves teaching the structure of the exam including how to read, interpret and answer diverse types of questions. The SAT/ACT course targets reading, writing, mathematics and science materials at a college-level of proficiency featured on the test as well as directing the student’s attention to master the materials, structure and automaticity needed to meet the demands of the new SAT/ACT.

SAT/ACT “PREP” at Lewis prepares students for what neuroscientists describe as “task switching” by featuring a blend of topics typically found in the “verbal”, mathematics and science sections. When students take the exam, they are asked to alternate between Critical Reading, Writing, Math and/or Science. Therefore, a preparation that rigorously incorporates such alternation is integrated in every aspect of this course of study. Each student acquires multisensory mechanics of language that facilitates written comprehension, word meaning and the detection of syntax or stylistic errors in writing. Since mathematics and science are separate languages, students will learn to analyze the meaning of word and numeric problems, interpret graphs and recognize problems.

The Lewis School specializes in working with students who have language-based learning differences related to dyslexia, dyscalculia, auditory processing, ADD and ADHD. The teaching approaches of the SAT/ACT offers great advantages for students with language-based learning differences and many traditional learners who seek the advantages of Lewis SAT/ACT preparation.
